Free Fireworks Spectacular returns!

The Rushmoor Fireworks Spectacular is back at Manor Park, Aldershot on **Saturday, 27th October** – and entry to the event will be free!

The event, organised by Rushmoor Borough Council is one of the biggest and best firework displays in the area, and is attended by over 12,000 people.

The format of the event is the same as last year, with gates opening at 5pm. A large funfair, with catering vehicles offering food and refreshments, will be available leading up to the 20-minute firework spectacular at 7.30pm, which will be presented by internationally renowned fireworks company, 'F1 Pyro'.
