Swimming Lessons

FSC enrolls new swimmers into lessons at any time in the year, subject to availability. New University Centre Farnborough Building opened by the Duke of Kent

HRH Prince Edward, Duke of Kent KG, was welcomed to the University Centre Farnborough on Tuesday 14th November. The Duke of Kent was invited to view facilities, meet students and staff, and unveil a commemorative plaque, which marked the official opening of Farnborough College of Technology's new University Centre Farnborough building. The new facility was funded by Farnborough College of Technology, with £2.61m Local Growth Fund from Enterprise M3 Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP).

The new building houses a modern library, seminar and meeting rooms, and social study areas. Students also benefit from the use of the new Study Centre in an adjacent building, which houses a lecture theatre, study spaces, and further seminar rooms.

University Centre Farnborough's Class of 2017 Graduate

University Centre Farnborough's annual ceremony for students graduating from Degrees and Higher Education courses saw staff and students come together to celebrate student achievements. Over 250 students graduated at the ceremony held at G Live, Guildford. Surrounded by friends and family, graduating students donned their gowns and took to the stage to receive their certificates.

Students graduating from the University Centre Farnborough included those obtaining their first degree, in courses ranging from Sport Science to English and Criminology. Students also graduated from Level 4 courses, Profession Qualifications, and Foundation Degrees.

Farnborough College of Technology Students Help Promote Special Educational Needs Website

The website www.braain.co.uk was launched on Saturday 28th October and was supported by 20 students from Farnborough College of Technology who created marketing materials for the launch. BRAAIN, or Be Ready ADHD ASD Information Network, aims to help parents access resources that specialise in supporting children with special needs as well as information about schools and charities.

BRAAIN founders, Nikki Roberts, Emma Collyer, and Helen Mardles, are all based in Farnborough, and have children with ADHD and ASD. They decided to set up the website after struggling to find the information they needed to support their children. When he heard about the website, Michael Cornwall, a Foundation and Entry Level Studies lecturer at Farnborough College of Technology, immediately wanted to help. To help with the launch, Michael's students held a competition to design a social media post to promote BRAAIN. Ryan Thompson, 17, from Godalming, won the competition, and his post has already been viewed over 6,500 times!

Special Visitors for Science Week at St Peter’s Junior School

St. Peter’s Junior School in Farnborough organized a science week by bringing in a wealth of professional experts (and their rather impressive props) across themes of flight, space, habitats and cars. From scientist parents of pupils, to dedicated visits from scientists from as far away as the UK Space Agency in Swindon, they have been overwhelmed by the support they received and look forward to igniting a spark in their own budding scientists.

Walking around the school during science week, sights that could be seen included hatching chicks, a space station built with Surrey University staff, BMW cars from Barons arriving on the playground, giant centipedes crawling in the hall, helicopters spiralling down the main staircase, and exploding cola bottles. Also, they were honoured to have Martin Tye, the Invictus Games Gold, Silver and Bronze medallist, host a special assembly. The former Lance Corporal was medically discharged from The Royal Logistic Corps after being injured in Kabul in 2009, when a suicide bomber drove into his vehicle. He lost the ability to walk.

Martin competed in six different sports at The Invictus Games held in Toronto this year – rowing, wheelchair rugby, powerlifting, athletics, wheelchair basketball and sitting volleyball, winning six medals in five of the events. He came along to talk about his time at the games, about the sports he chose and showed the children and staff his medals. The children were truly inspired by Martin and had many thought provoking questions to ask. He gave the children an insight into his life, explaining that he trains twice a day every day for up to 3 hours. The children were fascinated by their guest and were very grateful to be given the opportunity to engage with a national hero.

They all attended a 'Presentation Masterclass' delivered by Brandon O'Reilly, CEO, TAG Farnborough Airport on 23rd November which gave them plenty of advice, hints and tips for giving a good presentation. All the students then had two weeks to prepare their presentations, which could be on any aspect of aviation. The range of subject matter covered everything from the unsung and minority heroes and trailblazers of aviation to Concorde, the Arrows and the future of flight.
